In Spite of Glitches, Penske Pleased with Grand Prix

Despite the big kerfuffle involving warping pavement during the 2012 Chevrolet Detroit Belle Isle Grand Prix, organizer Roger Penske is happy with the overall turn of

The Belle Isle Grand Prix returned for the first time since 2008 and, given the challenges in putting the track and staging and sponsor support altogether at once, Penske was nonetheless very happy with what he saw over-

"I was thrilled for the weekend, when you look at the number of people who traveled to Belle Isle and the Isle was a jewel as part of Detroit, to me, to see the support of resources we had from the city, state and (Detroit city) council and all those volunteers who worked on the island for weeks to get it ready, to me we had great racing," Penske said.

lay in Detroit – we had some first at the Indy 500 – won by lessons to learn there," Penske said.

Indeed, it has been more than four years since there was any professional racing on Belle Isle and the track showed its wear-and-tear shape with pieces of tar and pavement buckling, causing a race delay.

But still, racing experts have said that the back-to-

Dario Franchitti – followed by the uneven race in Detroit won by Scott Dixon that drew more than 100,000 fans to the Isle throughout the three-day weekend, all bodes well for the future of IndyCar racing as a series that always seems to be in the rearview mirror of NASCAR.

Penske made his comments at Detroit city hall following that discussed progress being made between city, state and feds on the proposed M-1 rail line on Woodward, for which Penske's organization is playing a major part there.

Penske killed the proverbial two birds with one stone by participating in separate briefings on progress being made on M-1 rail on Woodward, followed by his take on the 2012 Chevrolet Detroit Belle Isle Grand Prix.

Overall, the racing impresario liked what he saw on Belle Isle in spite of the many challenges that are now familiar.

were happy and that's the deliverable I wanted - we showcased our city in a very positive way. "We brought the young people down from DPS (Detroit

Public Schools) on Friday so they could see about cars, technical, dynamic things,' Penske said of the student visitors to the track and paddocks. "The corporate community

stepped up - certainly General Motors and Chevrolet really showcased this.

"Our bus transportation worked out well, we had parking downtown, we had over 140 buses (shuttling fans and media on and off the isle) and that worked out very efficient-

"I want to thank Bud Denker and the whole team (which) did a really great job."

GM Plans Closing of Its Oshawa Plant, CAW Says

TORONTO (AP) - The Canadian Auto Workers union said last week that General Motors of Canada plans to close its consolidated plant in Oshawa, Ontario, by June 2013, leaving what could be as many as 2,000 workers out of a job.

The consolidated plant, which produces the Chevrolet Impala and the Equinox, was originally scheduled to close in 2008, but market demand for the vehicles enabled it to remain in business.

However, beginning in the fourth quarter of this year, the third shift at the plant will be removed and the second shift will be removed in the first quarter of next year, General Motors of Canada said.

Chris Buckley, a local union president, said along with the possible direct loss of up to 2,000 jobs with the plant closure, an additional 18,000 spinoff jobs will also be lost.

The union called the closure disgusting and shortsighted.

"General Motors should instead be focusing on utilizing its Canadian facilities as it seeks to further rebuild the company," said union president Ken Lewenza.

"The decision to close this very productive line and put 2,000 more workers out of a job is ill-thought-out and could damage the company in the long run," he said.

The union said Chevrolet Impala production will shift to a neighboring flex plant that also produces the Chevrolet Camaro, Buick Regal and Cadillac XTS cars, which means some workers whose jobs will disappear in the plant that's closing could be hired at the flex plant if it adds a third shift, but GM has not confirmed that a third shift will be added.

The Impala will also be built at GM's Detroit-Hamtramck assembly plant in Michigan.

The Equinox will be built at the company's former Saturn

assembly plant, originally the home of GM's now-defunct Saturn brand, shut down in 2009, though an engine plant on the site remained in opera-

GM agreed to reopen the Spring Hill plant under a new **GM-United Auto Workers pact** that brings only a minimal increase in fixed costs for the

automaker. There is some speculation that the automaker's Canadian counterpart is announcing this impending plant closure in part because of upcoming negotiations with the Canadian auto union and an effort to get the union to bend as far as

GM has been scaling back its overall operations in Canada as part of a North American restructuring begun two years ago under bankruptcy court protection.

That streamlining led to the loss of tens of thousands of jobs at the company's Canadian and U.S. operations and the shutdown of several plants.

In Canada, GM has already closed a truck plant in Oshawa and a transmission factory in Windsor, Ontario.

Buckley said the union has done everything GM has asked it to do with the intention of having jobs in the fu-

"There's been nothing but downsizing over the last few years, nothing but devastation. GM workers don't ask for a lot, they ask that they can go to work every day and make a living," said Buckley during a press conference.

Buckley said the federal and Ontario governments should get involved because they remain major shareholders to the tune of CA\$8 billion (US\$7.7 billion) as a result of government bailouts of the auto industry.

GM Canada currently employs more than 10,000 people across the country. In its heyday, the automaker had more than twice that number of employees in major operations in Oshawa, Windsor, and St. plant in Spring Hill, Tenn. That Catharines, Ontario.
