## Sentimental Journey: SH Supplier Tricks Out '67 Camaro

No question that the nostalgic atmosphere of the annual Woodward Dream Cruise plays upon sentiments linked to the Motor City and its auto traditions.

Case in point is Experi-metal, Inc., of Sterling Heights, which says that it manufactures quality "Made in the U.S.A." aftermarket components, steel body replacement parts, sub-assemblies and full steel bodies sold only through its dealer and distribution network.

Every year, EMI tricks out a classic car that plays on its theme of aftermarket parts production, all for display at the Woodward Dream Cruise, of course. The car in question this year is a 1967 Chevrolet Camaro - the first year the car was available back in the early, modern pony car era and a vehicle that was developed as GM's response to the popularity of the 1964-1/2 Mustang from Ford.

Al Sharp, vice president of Sales at EMI, grew up in Warren where his late father, Bill, was a GM Information Technology employee at the GM Tech Center in the 1960s and 1970s.

Sharp had his firm's Dream Cruise cars on display out in front of his shop on Wall Street in Sterling Heights the other day.

"That's a 45th Anniversary, 2012 Camaro (factory car) with an LS3 motor. The 1967 Camaro has an LS3 motor, custom interior, custom exhaust, Detroit Speed suspension – both of them have the Detroit Speed suspension," Sharp said. "I put in the engine, it's a crate motor.

"The 2012 is factory, the 1967 Ca-

maro is custom-made, same drivelines. Their uniqueness is their matching interiors, 45 years apart.

"I was 10 years old and I remember that car when it came off the production line," he further recalled.

"I was 10 years old and saw the original 1967 Camaro.

"At Experi-metal, we stamp the floor pans, quarter panels for the 1967. They are sold through CARS, Inc. and Sherman & Associates."

Sharp and his fellow Experi-metal employees always gather at the Radisson Hotel on Woodward Ave. in Bloomfield Hills, one of the key Dream Cruise stops between Birmingham and downtown Pontiac.

Located on the west side of the avenue, the Radisson hosts dozens of classic cars on its lawn on the day of the Cruise and the with these two Camaros among other vintage cruisers.

For the record, the 1967 car that Sharp eyed as a 10-year-old belongs to Al while his wife Donna will be driving the 2012. Sharp sees the 1967 as a tip-of-the-hat to his late father.

"He worked at the GM Tech Center in Information Technology - long before EDS got there. My dad was old-school, he graduated from GMI (the former General Motors Institute, now Kettering University) in 1957 - the same year I was born."

Ten years later, in 1967, his father would be able to show him the new Camaro in person. It's safe to say

Sharp's been a car guy ever since. In fact, Experi-metal's growing car collection is so distinct that a

Experi-metal crowd was there few years ago Sharp and EMI were even featured in the NewYork Times. A framed copy of that article hangs in the firm's lobby in Sterling Heights.

Otherwise, Sharp and EMI have also been branching out, so that, besides producing those aftermarket parts for 1955 Chevrolets and 1932 and 1934 Ford 3window coupes, they've also been producing engine nacelles for aerospace and other parts and systems for homeland secu-

But it's the classic cars they trick out for the Dream Cruise every year that brings out the smiles for staff and management alike. Look for the twin Camaros, black with orange racing trim, on the lawn at the Radisson on the


