## Lorenzo Cultural Center's 'Gears' Exhibit **Examines Impact of Industrial Revolution**

Though the industrial revolution began in America long before the launch of Michigan's automotive history, both reside quite comfortably side-by-side at Macomb Community College's Lorenzo Cultural Center in Clinton Township, featured in an exhibit called, "Changing Gears: the Birth of American Industry."

Most of the inventors featured in the exhibit are familiar figures. such as Henry Ford and Eli Whitney, Thomas Edison and Nikola Tesla.

Others are notable but somehow obscure, though the concepts and technologies they developed are much more wellknown, like Elias Howe and his sewing machine.

At first, the connection between Howe's 1846 invention and today's automotive industry is hazy. But a descendant of that first sewing machine stitches the interiors of modern vehicles.

Other clever connections are the subject of hour-long lectures and multi-media presentations, another part of the Changing Gears exhibit.

Those presentations range from "Detroit Before the Horseless Carriage" to "Photographing Industry" and include historical figures such as Francis Cabot Lowell, Martha Hay, George Westinghouse, William Q. Atwood, Nikola Tesla and Thomas Edison.

Alongside the general exhibit floor are two special rooms, one featuring artifacts from an Industrial Revolution-era train depot, the other a lumber camp.

There's also a large movie room, showing relevant videos from PBS, The History Channel, and more


