Northern Michigan Museum Seeking More 'Snowmobilia'

Among the Upper Peninsula's many attractions is a small museum dedicated to, appropriately, the snowmobile.

It's called the Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum, and it's a haven for anyone interested in snowmobiles, history, or mechanics - or any combination of the three.

Located in Naubinway, less than an hour west of the Mackinac Bridge, the Snowmobile Museum is home to 3,500 square feet of "snowmobilia" and the unexpectedly rich history of the industry.

It all began, says Charlie Vallier, chairman of the museum's board of directors, with a Canadian inventor named Joseph-Armand Bombardier.

Bombardier tinkered with mechanical devices in his teens, earning him a modest living and respect from local farmers. But when, as a young father, he lost his two-year-old son because there was no way to get across the snow-covered miles to a hospital for care, he focused his attention on over-the-snow transportation, and the modern snowmobile was born.

Quite a collector himself, Vallier has an assortment of 150 snowmobiles of his own.

Over the years, he has formed friendships with several other snowmobile collectors and aficionados

For years, Vallier and his snowmobile friends talked about opening a museum, and one day five years ago, they did, forming a 501(c)(3) organization, enabling

them to accept monetary and snowmobile-related donations in exchange for tax write-offs.

Vallier says that the generous donations of other snowmobile lovers and history buffs will enable the museum to break ground on a new building, twice the size of their current space, in the spring of 2013.

More room, of course, means the need for more "snowmobilia" to fill it with, so Vallier is appealing to the public to donate items, large and small.

We were just in Dearborn recently, picking up two snowmobiles," says Vallier.

Vallier also issued an open invitation to nature lovers, winter sports fanatics, and snowmobile enthusiasts to join the 21st Annual Top of the Lake Snowmobile Show and Ride on Feb. 15-16.

Proceeds from the event will

benefit the new building fund, explains Vallier, and the ride also presents an opportunity for people who haven't been to the museum yet to marvel at the exhibits and displays. This year's event drew more than 140 riders, most of whom visited the museum.

Opel Names Neumann to CEO Post

FRANKFURT, Germany (AP) -General Motors has appointed the former head of Volkswagen's China business to try to turn around its lossmaking European division, Opel.

The Adam Opel AG board of directors last week named Karl-Thomas Neumann as CEO. Neumann, 51, also got the title of head of GM Europe and GM vice president. Neumann formerly headed parts maker Continental AG and ran Volkswagen's booming China business for two years until August 2012.

He inherits a tough job from his predecessor, Karl-Friedrich Stracke, a veteran GM exec who resigned abruptly last year amid poor sales and earnings. GM has struggled for years to make money with its European business. Ruesselsheim-based Opel faces weak demand from a slow European economy and tough competition with other automakers for sales of smaller, mass-market cars that bring less profit than

pean manufacturing capacity to cut costs. Union agreements make it hard to close factories. GM lost \$478 million pretax in

Europe in the third quarter, compared with a \$292 million loss a year earlier. GM has predicted further European losses this year but expects to cut them by a third to a half this year, breaking even by mid-decade.

Opel, which makes both Opel and Vauxhall cars, had been headed on an interim basis by strategy chief Thomas Sedran since the abrupt resignation of Stracke last year.

Steve Girsky, chairman of the Opel board, said that Neumann "has a proven track record in growing business in a profitable way as well as in turnarounds."

GM CEO Dan Akerson said the move "will ensure we have the best possible leadership in place as we continue driving toward profitability and growth in Europe.


