The two rallies feature up to 100 vehicles for participating iournalists to drive and evaluate.

A field of 79 automotive journalists propelled the Fusion into the number one slot. With 17 first-place votes and 78 total points, the Fusion edged out the 2013 Honda Accord (62 points) and the 2013 Mazda CX-5, (59 points)

In each round of voting, three points were awarded for a firstplace vote, two for second and one point each for third.

Other vehicles among the final 10 contenders after voting took place at each rally were the 2012 Buick Verano; 2013 Cadillac ATS; 2013 Dodge Dart; 2013 Ford Escape; 2013 Hyundai Azera; 2013 Hyundai Santa Fe Sport and 2013 Nissan Altima.

"I think the new Fusion is certainly a beautiful car," said Bell. "It brings a sense of style to the mostly mundane mid-size car market.'

'Home in Macomb' Program Honors Local Businesses

Four Macomb County businesses were recently recognized for their contributions to the community and are now being touted as leaders in their respective industries.

The businesses were honored during the first-ever Macomb Business Awards, held Feb. 12 at the Sterling Inn Banquet and Conference Center in Sterling Heights.

'This was our first year doing this," said Stephen Cassin, Macomb County Planning and Economic Development executive director. "We feel we have to honor our own.

Roughly 50 companies were nominated to win a crystal award and representatives for each were on hand.

Four categories - efficiency, workforce development, diversification and corporate citizenship were up for grabs with one winner in each.

"We had a panel of judges who independently graded the nominees and submitted those scores," said Cassin. "That's how the winners were selected.'

The judges included Dr. Jim Jacobs, president of Macomb Community College, Cindy Goodaker, executive editor for Crain's Detroit Business and Gene Lovell, president of Macomb County's First State Bank.

Among the honorees were General Dynamics Land Systems of Sterling Heights, Omega Plastics of Clinton Township, Fori Automation of Shelby Township, and IBEW-**NECA Electrical Industry Training** Center of Warren.

General Dynamics Land Systems received the Energy Efficiency Expert award for their efforts to reduce consumption by 20

Omega Plastics took home the Corporate Citizen award for al-

Fori Automation received the Diversification Leader honor for expanding its reach beyond the automotive industry.

IBEW-NECA Electrical Industry Training Center received the Champion of Workforce Development award for its apprenticeship

"It's nice to be appreciated and to be able to encourage others," said Mike Pavlica, vice president of Omega Plastics, "We were very surprised and honored to receive the award.'

The company has been located in Clinton Township since its beginnings in 1984 and Pavlica said their motto is "To do great work so that we can do good works in the community.'

"It's an honor to be recognized as a leading business in Macomb County," said Mike Beck, vice president of Fori Automation. "This award was in response to a goal to diversify our operations in the non-automotive area."

The company has branched out

ed producing products for the aerospace, agriculture and recreational vehicle industries.

"Automotive is still our backbone," said Beck, "but like many other companies, the goal is to diversify.'

Macomb Community College was also recognized and received the 2013 Economic Development Partner of the Year award for its partnership with the county that goes back almost 25 years.

The awards are part of the "Home in Macomb" business retention program, started in November 2012

"The idea is to provide services to businesses to keep them here," said Cassin, "We thought it would be nice to recognize them."

There are approximately 18,000 businesses in Macomb County and they combine to employ 287,000 people.
