volume sales vehicles such as the Silverado and the Sierra.

"This gen-5 engine is an improvement all around in terms of efficiency," Jocsak.

"And it's been able to maintain its relatively small size and that's what sets it apart from other engines in other pickup trucks of similar size. It's certainly smaller than the engine used in Toyota's truck in the same category.'

When asked where GM goes next, in terms of engine technology, Jocsak said, "We will continue to look for more efficiencies.'

He added that improvements to the 2014 Corvette Stingray went beyond just using a new and better engine.

"We, of course, improved the engine for the 2014 Corvette Stingray," Jocsak said. "But we also improved things like the interior of the vehicle.

So, among other improvements made to the interior, the new Corvette Stingray has a new and better-designed steering wheel as well as new and improved seats.

"By improving these details, we make the Corvette a better car," Jocsak said. "But when you think about it, it makes sense. These are the parts of the car that people actually touch and interact with. By making them better, it makes the driving experience better.'

Jocsak said that while people have shown some interest in the new gen-5 engine GM has on display at the SAE Congress, their real interest seems to be in looking at the actual Corvette they

are showing at the company's booth at SAE Congress 2013 at Cobo Center.

"This booth gives people a chance to get close to the new Stingray," Jocsak said. "I'm an engineer and am proud of the work we put into the engine, but people here at the SAE Congress seem more interested in the styling.

"So that shows that the work we put into looks and interior matter. And we are getting some questions about the engine as



So when a driver of the new

Chrysler's Cherokee is also Cherokee decides that he or she doesn't need four-wheel drive because of the terrain the vehicle is being driven on, that driver can turn off the four-wheel drive confident that the vehicle won't lose any power. While competitive systems by OEMs can shift from fourwheel to two-wheel drive, they can't without experiencing the aforementioned parasitic drivetrain loss, Mayne said.
