## Crowds Flock to Cars 'R' Stars Show at Packard Grounds

It's one of the oldest classic car shows in Michigan and every year thousands of spectators come to visit.

This year was no exception as the 2013 Cars 'R' Stars show proved to be another success.

Several thousand spectators and hundreds of vehicles made the trip to the Packard Proving Grounds in Shelby Township June 9 to get a glimpse of cars both old and new.

Formerly known as Carnival of Cars, this is the event's fourth year taking place at the proving grounds.

Each year, the show has a special feature – this year's was "Tin Can Tourists." A special section was set up for vintage trailers and motor coaches throughout time, including the hallmark aluminum-constructed Airstream trailers of the 1950s and '60s.

We try to have a unique feature each year," said Tom Mitchell, Cars 'R' Stars chairman. "The first year, we held the event it was 'woodies' (vehicles with wood paneling along the side) and last year it was dragsters."

According to Mitchell, this year they were looking outside the box, so to speak, when they came across the "Tin Can Tourists.'

We're constantly trying to improve the show and make it more attractive to visitors," he said.

Some new things to this year's show were two 50/50 raffle drawings and bathrooms installed at the proving grounds.

While the vintage cars are the main attraction, the "Tin Can Tourists" feature drew quite a crowd.

Several of the vintage trailers had classic cars towing them and participants came from Michigan, Ohio and Ontario.

Michael and Tina Lambert drove a little more than two hours, from St. Thomas, Ontario, to take part in the show.

The two are members of the "Tin Can Tourist" club and brought their 1962 Bambi Airstream trailer, towed by their blue-and-white 1956 Ford Fair-

"This is our first time here." said Tina. "The vintage trailers are great to pair with the classic
