Campbell Ewald Building Becomes VEC East

Improvements at the Tech Center's VEC building and VEC East building should be seen not as a mere construction project, but as part of a total transformation of GM and its culture.

At least that's what Candice Messing, program manager for Global Technical Center Transformation said.

Over the past couple of years GM has launched a series of infrastructure improvements to its facilities around the world. These projects include the purchasing of the old Campbell Ewald office building on Van Dyke across from the Tech Center, as well as ongoing remodeling of the VEC building.

As more people move to the Tech Center, the need for office space has grown, Messing said. So when Campbell Ewald moved its offices from its building in Warren to downtown Detroit in 2014, GM was able to purchase the 10-story structure, which they've since named VEC East.

But moving people to the location was more complicated than many people assumed, Messing said. First, the structure dates back to the 1970s. That means, Messing said, that it really wasn't up to modern building codes. They had to do things like widen

the air vents and modernize the wiring. The building predates high-tech communications systems that use the Internet.

"When Campbell Ewald moved out at the end of 2014, we were able to buy the building and take advantage of some prime office space right by the Tech Center," Messing said. "We needed the room and it's not often that a prime location like that becomes available.

After GM bought the building, the company began top-to-bottom refurbishing of the location. That means new vents, new wiring and a new way of using that office space, Messing said. Since coming out of bankruptcy, GM has undergone a cultural

Having a blood drive in the last week of December is a good way to end the year.

At least that's the thinking at Art Van, said company spokeswoman Diane Charles. That's why the company held its eighth annual blood drive Dec. 29 at the company's training center on 14 Mile in Warren.

"We've been holding a blood drive at the end of the year for a while," Charles said. "It's a simple way to support the local community, and Red Cross blood drives are a great cause that help

a great many people."

Charles said that the need for blood is great at this time of the year for various reasons, including cold and flu season and accidents caused by bad weather affecting road conditions.

General Motors Could Be Big OEM Winner for 2016

It looks like 2016 will be a good in an estimated 17.4 million seathe trend of consumers moving toward trucks and SUVs.

General Motors could report the greatest volume increase in December 2016 and Kelley Blue Book projects a 1 point increase in market share, said Tim Fleming, analyst for Kelley Blue Book.

In contrast to most automakers, General Motors' growth is highlighted by a mid-size car, the Chevrolet Malibu. The new generation of Malibu has been wellreceived by critics, and is one of just two mid-size cars to increase sales volume this year.

Hyundai-Kia also could capture share this month and increase sales by 3 percent, Fleming said. However, much of the increase can be attributed to an expected increase in fleet sales, similar to the rest of the calendar

New-vehicle sales are expected to decrease 2 percent yearover-year to a total of 1.6 million units in December 2016, resulting

sales year for GM cars despite sonally adjusted annual rate (SAAR), according to Kelley Blue Book www.kbb.com, the vehicle source.

"December is shaping up to be the biggest sales month of 2016, even though it will likely fall short of last year's record results," said Fleming. "At yearend, 2016 light-vehicle sales should total 17.4 million, just 0.1 percent short of 2015's record year. Sales for the month will be boosted by plentiful retail incentives featured in many holiday sales events across the country, and one last push to hit year-end sales objectives.'

Kelley Blue Book expects further slowdowns in 2017, and its experts forecast sales in the range of 16.8 to 17.3 million, which would represent a 1 to 3 percent decrease from this year, Fleming said.

"Substantial incentive hikes

GM is Caught Up in Chinese Power Move

BEIJING (AP) – General Motors Co.'s main joint venture in China was fined \$29 million last week on charges it suppressed competition by enforcing minimum sales prices for dealers, the latest in a string of penalties against foreign auto brands under the country's anti-monopoly law.

Chinese regulators have punished companies in industries from milk to medical devices under a 2008 anti-monopoly law in

what appears to be an effort to force down consumer prices.

Dec. 23's announcement followed public criticism by U.S. President-elect Donald Trump of Chinese trade practices but there was no indication the case was linked to that. GM had announced in August 2014 its joint venture, Shanghai GM, was under investigation by anti-monopoly regulators.

The Shanghai Price Bureau

said Shanghai GM, a joint venture with state-owned Shanghai Automotive Industries Corp., improperly suppressed competition by enforcing minimum prices dealers were allowed to charge for Cadillac, Chevrolet and Buick models.

That "disrupted the normal order of market competition," the statement said.

Art Van Holds Blood Drive at Red Cross's Crucial Time

But at the same time, the number of available donors declines.

"People are busy with the holidays," Charles said. "They don't think about giving blood because they're so busy. And, a lot of people are just out of town. They've gone to visit the grandparents or decide to spend a little time in a warmer climate. So they aren't available to give blood. This drive is a way of addressing that problem. And, in Detroit, a lot of people have the holidays off, so when they hear about this blood drive, they can come."

Jamila Wilson, account manager for the American Red Cross. said that Charles is right, and that at a drive like the Art Van one, they expect to get 82 units donated.

"To get that 82, we will see about 100 people seeking to donate," Wilson said. "Some people who seek to donate have to be turned away for different medical reasons. They might be on medication or have a slight cold. Things like that."

Getting blood is a seven-day-aweek job, Wilson said. They hold blood drives every day, and having a partner like Art Van is really helpful, she said.

Karen Swofford of Harrison Township was one of the suc-

cessful donors at the Art Van drive.

"I come here every Christmas to donate," Swofford said. "I give blood as often as I can. I'm working on getting my six-gallon pin right now. I remember the first time I gave blood, I was so scared. But after that, it's no big deal, especially at my age. You get used to be being poked with needles."

Theresa Thor is a fraud examiner for Art Van. She started giving blood when she was 20 and is now 54.

"I give as often as I can," Thor said. "My blood type is O negative, so every six weeks I get a call. O negative is the universal donor and much in demand by hospitals. I like to give because I had some family members who had medical problems and they were helped out by blood donations."

Thor said she's so used to giving blood that she came with a "rapid pass" to the Art Van drive.

"The rapid pass is great," Thor said. "You go online and fill out a questionnaire the day you're scheduled to donate. You answer all the questions that you would normally be asked at the donation site. You give the questioner the rapid pass printout that indicates you're ready to donate. It's a real time saver. It allows the staff to handle more donors and

in a more efficient way. You give them the pass, and all they have to do is take your blood pressure."

Wilson said that the Red Cross holds blood drives in and around Detroit every day.

China Fines GM for 'Monopolistic' Practices

Setting minimum retail prices is a common practice in many but lawyers markets Chinese regulators to regard it as an improper restraint on competition.

A statement by the price bureau said the penalty was set at 4 percent of Shanghai GM's annual sales, or 201 million yuan (\$29 million).

In a statement, GM said: "GM fully respects local laws and regulations wherever we operate. We will provide full support to our joint venture in China to ensure that all responsive and appropriate actions are taken with

respect to this matter." GM vies with Germany's Volkswagen AG for the status of the top-selling vehicle brand in

Sales of GM vehicles in China rose 7 percent in November over a year earlier to 371,740 units. Year-to-date sales rose 8.5 percent to 3.4 million.

Audi, VW's luxury unit, was fined \$40.5 million and Fiat Chrysler Automobiles' Chrysler brand received a smaller penalty in 2014 on similar charges of enforcing minimum sales prices.

State media cited an official saying Daimler Benz AG's Mercedes unit was guilty of violations but no penalty was announced. Toyota Motor Corp. said its Lexus unit was under scrutiny but no results have been announced.

A dozen Japanese auto parts suppliers were fined by the Chinese governement earlier on price-fixing charges.

The industry-wide investigation began in 2014 following complaints foreign auto brands were abusing their control over supplies of spare parts to overcharge consumers.

this year haven't resulted in retail growth, while inventories continue to grow," said Fleming. "An increasing supply of used cars, especially off-lease units, is already putting pressure on residual values, which could impact the sustainability of today's high levels of leasing.

"We are looking for manufacturers to cut production in the new year to better match slowing consumer demand and alleviate the need for elevated incentives.'

Here are some key highlights for the estimated December 2016 sales forecast:

- In December, new light-vehicle sales, including fleet, are expected to hit 1,600,000 units, down 2 percent from December 2015 and up 16 percent from November 2016.
- The SAAR for December 2016 is estimated to be 17.4 million, even with December 2015 and down from 17.8 million in November 2016.
- Retail sales are expected to account for 81.1 percent of volume in December 2016, down from 81.4 percent in December

After all numbers are tallied, Blue Book expects Hyundai-Kia total fleet sales to be up 20 percent in 2016, which is one of the highest increases in the industry, Fleming said.

Mid-size SUVs and crossovers are on pace to be one of the fastest growing segments in December 2016, helped by moderate gas prices and seemingly limitless consumer demand for utility vehicles. The Toyota Highlander, Subaru Outback and new GMC Acadia could see some of the biggest increases in the segment, Fleming said.

On the flip side, mid-size cars will have yet another down month, the 10th in a row, and analysts expect the segment's market share to dip nearly a full percentage point. Overall market share for all cars looks like it will end the year around 39 percent, down from 42 percent in 2015 and down 10 points since 2012. As the industry heads into 2017, there is no indication that this trend will slow, Fleming said.

There are 27 sales days in December 2016, compared with 28 sales days in December 2015. All percentages are based on raw volume, not daily selling rate.

And part of that change is how people interact, said Messing.

In the old days, bosses had offices with window views and the rest of the staff worked in cubicles that closed them off from their co-workers.

"We asked who deserves a window view," Messing said. "The answer is everyone. So what we've been doing at GM buildings, including the VEC building, is rebuilding them in a way that places tables and desks in the open. That way everyone gets sunlight."

And lighting is important, Messing said.

"A ton of studies have been done showing that people work better under natural light," she said. "Our new way of working has done away with traditional offices. People don't have to go to one place to work. We do provide lockers so that people can store their personal items, so if you have a red stapler, you can put it there."

But by having everyone work in the open, people aren't cut off from their co-workers and the spirit of collaboration is strengthened.

In the newly-rebuilt VEC East building, formerly the Campbell Ewald building, in addition to updating the site to modern building standards, they basically cut holes in the middle of the third and fourth floors, and the fifth

and sixth floors. That allows people on different floors to be able to look up and down and see their co-workers.

"We're also putting a new cafeteria on the 10th floor," Messing said. "It will be a beautiful space where people can get food. It provides a panoramic view of the surrounding community and I didn't realize this until I actually visited the space, but you can see the Renaissance Center from the 10th floor."

Part of the idea behind the new cafeteria, Messing said, was that it can be used as a work space even when people aren't eating. That way space isn't wasted.

"The old Campbell Ewald building had something that kind of looked like a cafeteria in the basement," Messing said. "But we put our cafeteria on the top floor and it's state-of-the-art."

The VEC East building is still undergoing some reconstruction, Messing said. The top four floors were the first ones redone. People moved to them in February of 2016. They then started work on the rest of that building and work is expected to be fully completed by February of 2017.

"Right now we're using that building to house long-term and short-term turnaround-housing," Messing said. "That means people who will be moving to other parts of the Tech Center get their feet wet in terms of getting used to the new work methods. We want to make the work environ-

ment at GM so nice that people won't want to go home."

These ideas of modern office space are being applied to multiple GM buildings, Messing said. When it came time to rebuild the old Campbell Ewald building and make it VEC East, it gave GM the opportunity to put in the new concepts into the structure from the ground up.

Brian Goebel, a spokesman for GM, said that Mark Reuss and his staff will be moving into newly-refurbished offices in the VEC building in late January or early February. These offices are designed along the new working concepts GM has implemented elsewhere.

"People accepting new working conditions depends on a couple of factors," Messing said. "One of them is seeing bosses going along with the new way of doing things.

"We like to say that Mark and his staff are leaving 'mahogany row' and they will be able to be seen working in the new environment at the Tech Center. They're expected to move in by the end of January."

By having open spaces, by having coffee centers, people will be able to communicate better, Messing said.

Even if they spend most of their five-minute conversation talking about sports, they usually eventually start talking about work.

That's not something they do

when placed behind cubicle walls, Mesing said, shut off from each other.

"We want people to own their space," Messing said. "Mary Barra likes to say that people don't learn all in the same way, and they don't work in the same way. We now make it possible for people to work in the seven different ways people work. My favorite emails are the ones that begin, 'I never thought I would write this email because I didn't think I would like these working conditions.' Normally, it takes about six months for people to get used to a new working environment. We expect that. But it's always nice to receive emails right away from people who like the changes.'

Messing said that she came to GM after being an intern 15 years ago. She started in Operations and transitioned into Facilities. She said she has a passion for her work because it improves the way people work and makes General Motors a better place for its employees.

"We are transforming the Tech Center Campus," Messing said. "When we're done, it will be a whole new environment. What we're doing is so much more than a construction project."

This new philosophy is important, Goebel said, because the new General Motors is not about polishing up the past of the company, it's about creating the future in a way that gets the best from people.

Automotive Society Honors Levin For Preserving History

MotorCities National Heritage Area recently presented its 2016 Milestone Award to long-serving U.S. Senator Carl Levin.

MotorCities National Heritage Area is a nonprofit dedicated to historic preservation of the automotive and labor industries.

Levin helped create the legislative groundwork for the Automobile National Heritage Area in 1998 and was instrumental in its Congressional reauthorization in 2014.

A longtime champion for the automotive industry and for the preservation of its history and culture, Levin said he believes automotive heritage is a source of great pride for many Michigan residents.

"This award relates to a subject that is dear to my heart, dear to the hearts of every person who lives in Michigan," said Levin on accepting the award.

"It's a matter of great pride to everybody who lives here, works here, or has benefited from the automotive industry.

"The middle class was almost born here; it surely was promoted by the automobile industry."

Levin called it a "critically important heritage," and commended the work of MotorCities to preserve, promote and interpret that heritage through grant funding, educational programming and tourism.

MotorCities Executive Director Shawn Pomaville presented the award, and thanked the senator for his unyielding commitment to the National Heritage Area.

"Our work would not have been possible without Senator Levin's creation of National Heritage Area in 1998, and again in 2014, when he paved the way for the reauthorization of the MotorCities so that we were able to retain our affiliation with the

National Park Service," said Pomaville.

This marks the third year of the MotorCities Milestone Award.

In 2015, The Hon. U.S. Rep. John Dingell received the award along with the UAW International Union – each part of a group that came together with an idea to preserve Southeastern Michigan's rich auto and labor heritage.

National Heritage Areas are places where natural, cultural, historic and scenic resources combine to form a cohesive nationally important land-scape.

Through the combination of the keyless entry and start system PASE (Passive Start and Entry) and biometric elements, the international technology company is opening up new possibilities in the field of vehicle personalization and authentication, said Continental spokeswoman Mary Araf.

"The integration of biometric elements brings our expertise in systems integration to the forefront, as we are linking our access control solution with other intelligent systems in vehicles to ensure increased comfort and safety for all passengers," said Michael Crane, head of Continental's Body & Security business unit, North America. "In addition, the access systems allow us to only control specific components as needed. This means that components are not required to operate continuously, which saves energy and increases efficiency."

Fingerprint-controlled engine start and authentic personalization are just some of the technology Continental will be showing off at CES this year, Araf said.

Depending on the system configuration, automotive manufacturers can introduce another level of security to their vehicles using biometrics.

Introducing a biometric element could mean, for example, that the presence of a valid key inside the vehicle is no longer enough to start the engine as the driver is also required to provide authentication using a fingerprint sensor, Crane said.

This two-fold authentication process significantly increases the vehicle's anti-theft protection measures.

Biometric elements also allow drivers to personalize their vehicles. The system is connected to an interior camera, which recognizes the driver's face and automatically personalizes vehicle settings, such as seat and mirror position, music, temperature and navigation for the driver.

Continental's Intelligent Glass can also be integrated, which allows drivers to gradually darken almost all windows of the vehicle and which lightens them automatically when the driver approaches, Crane said.

It is possible to integrate the biometric system in all intelligent systems, regardless of the access technology used in the vehicle (Bluetooth Low Energy or low frequency).

Continental will outline its latest developments in digital mobility and automated driving during CES 2017 Media Days on Jan. 4.





Cobo Center recently completed a \$2 million technology upgrade, just in time for the North American International Auto Show. The work includes an upgraded Nortel core switch that distributes the WiFi signal, along with several new Nortel edge switches located throughout the

"For the visitors that use our WiFi network, these upgrades will be like moving from a onelane highway to a three-lane super-speedway," said Claude Molinari, general manager of Cobo Center.

System improvements also include upgrading WiFi access points to 802.11ac Aruba APs and increasing the number of APs to 400 throughout the facility. The network location of APs and configuration will be remapped based on events' anticipated high use of WiFi in specific areas.

This pre-planning creates design cost-effective networks that support uninterrupted digital services while minimizing crosschannel interference that can result from excessive and disorganized access points.

These WiFi upgrades will allow 32,000 simultaneous users on the network. The amount of data traffic at NAIAS has more than doubled in the past two years and these upgrades will assure a better user experience, said Molinari.

Discovery during pre-event planning for a show in Cobo Center may reveal estimated high usage, in which case, the Technology Services department is prepared to add more APs to smooth out the user's experience and allow for a greater number of guests and their wireless devices to access the Internet at ever-increasing speeds.

To create a more flexible WiFi

network, the ClearPass Access Management System was installed to create an integrated platform, allow coherence of private networks and create a WiFi splash page for the facility-wide "CoboFree" WiFi network, that will require users to click through a splash page designed to highlight sponsors or include advertisers, thus generating event revenue.

"We will be launching our WiFi splash page feature at this year's North American International Auto Show (NAIAS) to allow the show to display their branding to more than 800,000 attendees when they use the Cobo Free WiFi throughout the facility," said Molinari. "We expect this to be a huge asset to events wishing to extend their brand and their sponsor brands to everyone."
